ELECTION RULES AND REGULATIONS

 There will be polls in every registered local in the province. Polls will be open from 10:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M., August I, 1980.

Each local will be required to send a voter's list to the Chief Returning Officer. This list will contain the names of every ELIGIBLE voter in the local.

An eligible voter is anyone described in By-law =1 Subsection (2)

3.
