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Cyprien Morin was one of the original recorded residents of what is now Meadow Lake, Saskatchewan. Some of the information gathered on Cyprien Morin was recorded in *Heritage Memories: A History of Meadow Lake and Surrounding Districts*, published by the Meadow Lake Diamond Jubilee Heritage Group in 1981.

Cyprien Morin was born in 1836 at Methye Portage, near La Loche, in what is now northwestern Saskatchewan to Antoine Morin and Pélagie Boucher. Antoine Morin came to present-day northern Saskatchewan from Lower Canada (now Québec) and Pélagie was originally from what is now northern Alberta/Saskatchewan.

Antoine Morin was born on September 7, 1804 at Maskinongé, Lower Canada to Thomas Morin and Marie-Thérèse Aubry-Francoeur. Antoine Morin died in 1855. At the time, he was employed by the Hudson's Bay Company. Pélagie Boucher was the daughter of a Métis, Joseph Boucher and a Dené woman whose name is unknown. On her Half-breed Scrip application, Pélagie stated that she was born at Peace River, in what is now northern Alberta in 1803.

The 1881 Census taken at Green Lake (in present-day northwest Saskatchewan) shows Pélagie Boucher living in the home of Pierre-Marie Morin, her grandson. Pierre was a son to Pélagie's son Raphaël. Her age was entered as 64, although it would have been closer to 75.

In 1891, Pélagie was still living in Green Lake, but now in the home of her second youngest son, Louis, who was married to Marguerite Jourdain. At this time, Pélagie's age was recorded as 85, which would have been close to her actual age.

The 1901 Census taken at Devil's Lake, North-West Territories (nineteenth century spelling; now Saskatchewan) shows Pélagie living in the home of Paul DeLaronde Sr. and Sophie Morin, one of her daughters. Sophie had previously been

married to a man with the surname Linklater. Sophie and Paul had one daughter. In the 1901 Census, Pélagie was recorded as being 106-years-old; however, her actual age would have been closer to 95. As indicated by these census documents, many people gave estimates of their age and other birth information.

Despite her age and the types of transportation available at the time, Pélagie was able to relocate far away from her previous residences. On November 21, 1902, a burial took place at Aldina, North-West Territories (now Saskatchewan) for a 109-year-old lady named "Melagie" Morin. However, because of inaccurate records, it is likely that this person was Pélagie Morin. Pélagie would have been near 96-years-old or possibly older, and was living at Devil's Lake which is near Aldina.

Antoine Morin and Pélagie Boucher started raising their family in the early 1820s. At the time, Antoine had moved to the area to work for the Hudson's Bay Company. In those days, many couples got married according to the law of the land, which was also referred to as *à la façon du pays* or "in the fashion of the country." On May 26, 1845, Antoine Morin married Pélagie Boucher, according to the Catholic Church, which had established a mission in Île-à-la-Croix

in what is now present-day northwest Saskatchewan.

Sarazine was Antoine and Pélagie Morin's oldest child. She would have been born prior to 1827 when her brother Antoine Morin Jr. was born. Sarazine died at Green Lake in 1905, with her age recorded as 85. On her Half-breed Scrip application, Sarazine stated that she was born in 1824 and that she married in 1842.

Sarazine Morin married Pierre Laliberte Sr., who was often referred to as "Pierriche." Sarazine and Pierre had a son named Joseph who married Mary Philomène Bell on January 26, 1885. The Green Lake Catholic Church record lists Joseph's mother as Sarazine Boucher. Boucher was the maiden name of Sarazine's mother, Pélagie. This was because Antoine and Pélagie had not been married by the

Catholic Church until 1845, approximately 20 years after Sarazine's birth. It is unclear if any of Antoine's and Pélagie's other children were referred to as Boucher as well. On Pélagie Morin's Half-breed Scrip application, it states that Sarazine was born at Slave Lake, and on her application, Sarazine referred to the area as "Athabasca."

Cyprien Morin had 14 siblings. On her Half-breed Scrip application, Pélagie Morin indicated that she had eleven living children and that four had died. The names of those living children were:

1. Sarazine—married Pierre "Pierriche" Laliberte
2. Antoine—married Mary Harkness
3. Raphaël—married Betsy Cook
4. Pierre—
5. Cyprien—married Marie Cook
6. Zéphyrin—married Madeleine Girard, and later Marie Elizabeth Jourdain
7. Marie—married Peter Linklater
8. Magloire—
9. Sophie—married a Linklater
10. Louis—married Marguerite Jourdain
11. Baptiste—

Only one name of Pélagie's and Antoine's deceased children, Judith, was found. She married Louis DeLaronde Jr. Their descendants can be found on the Flying Dust First Nation.

On his Half-breed Scrip application, Cyprien Morin claimed that he was born in 1836 in Athabasca, in what is present-day northeastern Alberta. Another document is more specific, showing that he was born on June 10, 1836. The Provincial Archives of Alberta have Oblate records showing that Cyprien Morin was baptized on May 25, 1845 along with four of his siblings.

Cyprien Morin was 88-years-old when he died in 1924 at Meadow Lake. He was interred in the St. Cyprien Cemetery. According to St. Cyprien Cemetery records, Cyprien Morin died on November 4 and was buried on November 8, 1924.

On his Half-breed Scrip application,

Cyprien gave the names and ages of his living children. They were Baptiste, Pierre, Pélagie, Jean-Marie, Joseph, Agnès, and Jérémie. He was also required to give the names of his deceased children: Stanislaus, William, George, and one who was not christened.

Heritage Memories: A History of Meadow Lake and Surrounding Districts recorded the names of Cyprien's children as Jean Baptiste Bear, Belligile, Joseph, John, Agnès and Jérémie. "Jean Baptiste Bear" should have been "Jean Baptiste" and "Pierre," "Belligile" was actually "Pélagie," and "John" was "Jean-Marie." This discretion in names could be due to the fact that the book was published nearly 50 years after Pierre's death and was most likely conducted from a verbal interview. There may have been mistranslations and misspellings of the names as well.

It has been suggested that "Cephron" was the name of Cyprien's father. However this is most likely due to confusion with the name of Cyprien's brother, "Zephyrin." Zephyrin lived in Green Lake until 1901 when he moved to Île-à-la-Crosse, where he passed away in 1917.

Charles C. Denney (Glenbow Archives and the Saskatchewan Archives Board) compiled information on the Métis families of Western Canada. In one of his comments he wrote, "Cyprien Morin was mentioned in the Crean Report (a government document) of 1909, he was described as a fine type of the 'old time Métis' and was also a 'raiser of cattle.'"

The 1881 Census

The 1881 Green Lake Census has a listing for Cyprien Morin. In this census, Cyprien's home was listed as the 30th home entered and the 33rd family living in the community. Prior to his entry, his sister Sophie Linklater and Paul DeLaronde Sr. were entered. The following entry was that of his son Baptiste and his first wife Marie Margaret Desjarlais. Cyprien had six people living in his house: his wife Marie, and his children, Joseph, Jean-Marie, Agnès, and Jeremiah (Jérémie).

The 1891 Census

The 1891 Green Lake Census began on April 6 and recorded four residents in Cyprien's household—himself, his wife, Marie, and his two youngest, children Agnès and Jérémie (Jeremiah).

Another census was taken on May 10, 1891 in the 200th District of Saskatchewan, Battleford, North-West Territories. This census was likely taken of the people living in the Meadow Lake region. Cyprien, along with his wife, Marie and children, John (Jean-Marie), Ainese (Agnès), and Jérémie were listed in this census.

Cyprien's wife, Marie Cook, was from around what is now La Ronge, Saskatchewan. Marie was a sister to Betsy Cook, who was married to Raphaël, Cyprien's older brother. Raphaël and Betsy Morin lived in Green Lake for a time and later moved to the Devil's Lake area. One source indicates that Betsy and Marie Cook were Jeremiah Cook's children. The 1881 Green Lake Census has Jeremiah, who was possibly named after his maternal grandfather, listed as the youngest child of Marie (Cook) Morin. Immediately following the census listing for Cyprien and his family, are those for Baptiste and Marie Morin. This may have been Baptiste, Cyprien's oldest son, and his second wife Marie Margaret Aubichon or it could have been Cyprien's youngest brother, Baptiste. Pélagie Boucher had mentioned this brother, Baptiste, when she filled out her Half-breed Scrip application.

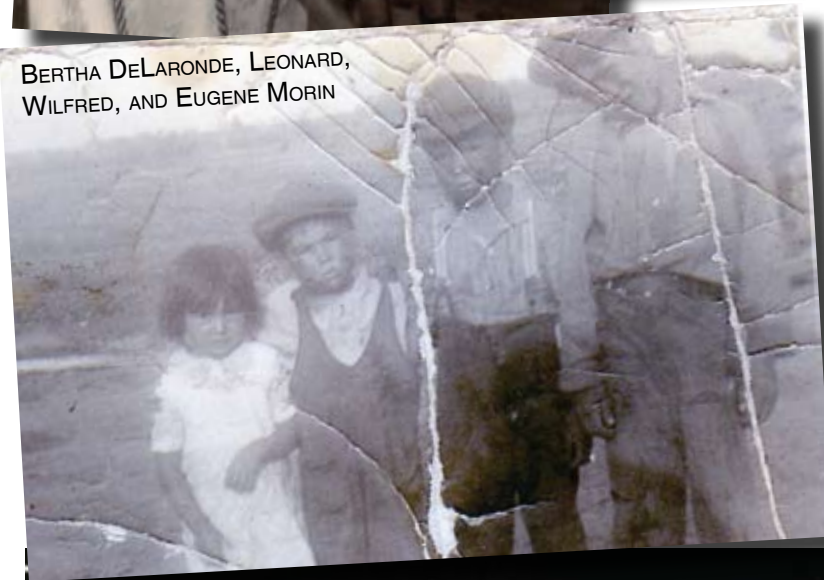
Baptiste, Cyprien's oldest son, entered the names of seven children in the April 1891 Green Lake Census. The Battleford District Census taken in May, 1891 did not have any children entered. The family listed after Baptiste and his family was that of Pierre Malboeuf, his wife Bella and their five children. The Bella listed in this census would have been Cyprien's oldest daughter, Pélagie. The children's names were Léon, Valerie, Cyprien, Matthew, and Almire.

In the 1891 Green Lake Census, Pierre and Pélagie Malboeuf are listed along with six children—Leo, Valerie, Cyprien, Clemin (f), Daniel and Emile (f). The ages of the children in the Battleford District (Meadow Lake) do not match up with the ages of the Malboeuf children in the Green Lake Census. At the time of this census, many northern people had recently applied for Half-breed Scrip. Therefore, there may have been confusion surrounding these names with similar sounding names on the Scrip applications.

The Malboeuf family later moved back to Île-à-la Crosse, their home community. The 1901 Île-à-la Crosse Census shows the following eight children in the Malboeuf household: Clementine, Daniel, Almire, Marie Agnès, Adelaide, and Couronne and Elise (m). The last two children were likely twins. According to the census, the first child, Clementine was born at Devil's Lake, the next four were born in Meadow Lake, and the twins were born in Île-à-la Crosse. Descendants of Daniel Malboeuf are still living in Beauval, Saskatchewan.

The 1901 Census

Cyprien's family was also recorded in the 1901 Meadow Lake Census. At this time, census information was also taken on the Flying Dust First Nation, known then as the Kopwayawakenum Band. Cyprien was closely related to five of the ten Métis families which appeared in the 1901 Census.

(1) The head of the first Métis family on the census was "Obichon Matayas" who was actually Mathias Aubichon. Mathias was originally from Green Lake and was born to Baptiste Aubichon Sr. and Philomène Gerard in 1872. Mathias married Lucie Morin in 1901. The daughter of Pierre Cyprien Morin and Véronique Chatelaine, Lucie was born in April of 1884 at Devil's Lake. Véronique's last name at the time of her marriage was recorded as Siyakikwaniw.

Lucie and Mathias had one daughter, Delphine who was born in 1902. After Lucie passed away, Mathias later remarried Rosalie McCallum of Green Lake.

(2) The second family that appeared in the 1901 Census was that of Cyprien's son-in-law William Laronde or DeLaronde. William Laronde married Cyprien's youngest daughter Agnès. The names of their children at that time were Elise, Aveline and Clarice. Aveline was actually known as "Alvina," and was married to William John Fiddler. Elise married Onésime Morin and Clarice married a man with the last name Springstead.

(3) The third family listed in the 1901 Census was that of Joseph Morin, Cyprien Morin's third oldest living son. He was married to Pélagie Linklater, also known as "Bella," although on the census her name is spelled "Elisia." Their oldest son was Norbert; however, "Henry" was entered on the census, followed by Augustine who later married Théophile Aubichon. Next was Christine, who married Julien Laliberte of Green Lake, who, after being widowed, married Dan Durocher of the Kopwayawakenum Band (Flying Dust

Reserve). And lastly, Mary Anne Morin, who married Theodore Fiddler, became a member of the Waterhen Lake Reserve. Norbert (Henry) married Flora Fiddler, a sister to Theodore Fiddler. They were married prior to the birth of their first son in 1918. Florence Fiddler was born in 1900, and her husband Norbert was born in 1890. Norbert's age of eleven listed in the 1901 Census matches his birth year of 1890.

(4) The fourth family listed was that of Pierre Morin. Pierre was Cyprien's second oldest son. The census included his wife Margaret and children, Paul, Margaret Marie, and Jean Marie. Margaret was Pierre Cyprien's second wife. He had been previously married to Véronique Chatelaine. Margaret was referred to as "Marie" at times. For example, in records for the St. Cyprien Cemetery, it is indicated that Pierre Cyprien, who died in 1932, was said to be Marie Morin's husband.

Jean Marie was baptized in the Green Lake area in 1897. Records show that Pierre Cyprien and Marie Morin were his parents. Pierre also had a brother with the same name—Jean Marie.

Paul Morin was the first child of Pierre Cyprien Morin listed in the census. Paul married Caroline Leblanc (Matchee) from the Flying Dust Reserve. She was the daughter of Michel Matchee and Madeline Bear. Caroline had a brother named Alexander Matchee.

Pierre's second child was Margaret Marie, also known by the nickname "*Wah-Zoo*." Alex DeLaronde says that Margaret married a man from the Onion Lake area. Both Margaret Marie and Paul Morin were living in Green Lake when the 1891 Census was taken.

Pierre's third child listed in the 1901 Census was Jean Marie who married Angélique Lafond. Both Jean Marie and Angélique died in 1918 at the ages of 22 and 23 respectively. Their son, Joseph Pierre Morin, passed away on November 6, 1918, as is shown in the St. Cyprien records.

(5) The fifth family on the 1901 Census was that of Cyprien (age 67) and Mary (age 56) Morin.

(6) The sixth family on the census was that of Jérémy Morin, Cyprien's youngest child. At the time of this census, Jérémy's wife, Marie Anastasia Bear, was 20-years-old while Jérémy was listed as 22. Jérémy and Marie were married in 1897. In 1908, Jérémy remarried Green Lake's Virginia Laliberte.

(7) The seventh family listed in the 1901 Census was that of Olivier Cantal, although his name was actually Olivier Quintal. He had come from Lac La Biche in what is now northeastern Alberta. He was a brother to Christine Arnault and was Louise's husband. Olivier and Louise had several children, the oldest being Moïse who later moved to the Loon Lake area where he raised a family. Moïse's family name changed in the records from "Quintal" to "Cantal" to "Cantre." Olivier and Louise also had some daughters who went on to marry local men. Oliver passed away in the 1940s,

and Louise died in 1916, and was buried in the St. Cyprien Cemetery.

(8) The eighth family on the census was that of Philippe Garnot. At this time, there were four people living in his household: Philippe, his wife Florestine (née Arcand) and their two children Adeline and Joseph. Florestine had a deceased son, Jean Baptiste, from a previous marriage with John Parenteau, for whom she applied for Half-breed Scrip.

(9) The ninth family in this census was that of Vital Cantal (Quintal). He was Olivier's brother. He was listed as the head of the seventh household in the 1901 Meadow Lake Census. Vital was married to Marie Chatelaine. Her Half-breed Scrip application includes the names of their children, the first-born, Henri and his brother Andrew. Vital and Marie had other children as well.

(10) The last family on the 1901 Census for Meadow Lake was that of a Métis, Sam Arnaud, or more properly Arnault. Sam was born in Alberta to Aimée Arnault and Isabelle Chalifoux. He married Christine Quintal, a sister to Olivier and Vital Quintal. On her Half-breed Scrip application, Christine used Justine for her first name. She died in 1946, and was buried as Christine Arnault in the Green Lake Cemetery. The names of Sam's and Christine's children are listed as Peter, Étienne, Alfred (Fred), Lillian and William. Alfred married Rosa Lafond from the Duck Lake/Beardy's area.

Sam's and Christine's oldest son, Peter was likely buried as Clarence Arnault in St. Cyprien Cemetery in 1918. He was gassed while serving overseas during WWI, and died in Meadow Lake shortly after returning home. William, the youngest son listed in this census, died in North Battleford in the 1990s. Alex, a younger son not listed, lived at one time in Green Lake, but died in North Battleford in 1996.

Sam Arnault had a brother named Norbert who was also referred to as Albert. Norbert lived with his nephew Alex, Sam's son. Norbert was buried in Meadow Lake in 1962. Alfred, who served in WWI, was also buried in Meadow Lake in 1962.

JEAN BAPTISTE MORIN

Jean Baptiste was Cyprien Morin's oldest son. He had two first cousins with the same name as well. All three Jean Baptiste Morins were buried in Green Lake. When the 1901 Census was conducted, Jean Baptiste indicated that his birthdate was December 10, 1856. Cyprien Morin's Half-breed Scrip application further supports this date, declaring that Jean Baptiste was born at Green Lake in 1856. Jean Baptiste was married twice: his first wife was Marie Margaret Desjarlais, and his second wife was Marie Margaret Aubichon.

Jean Baptiste married his first wife, Marie Margaret Desjarlais on September 5, 1877. They were married in the Green Lake Catholic Church by Father Prosper Légeard, OMI, and the ceremony was witnessed by Baptiste Payette and Zephyrin Morin, Cyprien's brother. Marie Desjarlais was the daughter of Michel Desjarlais and Cecile Durocher of Île-à-la-Crosse. In the 1881 Census, Jean Baptiste Morin's wife was referred to as "Margaret" but in most other cases she was referred to as "Marie." Jean Baptiste and Marie Margaret had seven recorded children:

Jules, born in 1878, was the first child of Jean Baptiste and Marie Morin. Little information on Jules was found other than a Half-breed Scrip application from his wife, Sophie Bear of the Flying Dust Reserve. From interview sources and baptismal records, Jules and Sophie had two children, Julienne born in 1896 and Joseph François born in 1898. The Flying Dust Census lists Sophie as using her husband's name, Jules Morin, and lists her as female, the head of the household, and married.

EUGENIE (MORIN) KENNEDY

Eugenie was the second child and the oldest daughter of Jean Baptiste Morin and Marie Margaret Desjarlais. The Green Lake Church record indicates that Eugenie was born on March 15, 1880 with her grandparents, Cyprien Morin and Marie Cook listed as her Godparents.

According to records, Eugenie Morin was married twice. She did not have any children from her first marriage to Joseph Larivière on July 19, 1897. A few years later, Eugenie Morin and Antoine Kennedy were married on August 21, 1899. For both marriages, her father Jean Baptiste was one of the witnesses and Father Teston was the officiating priest. When Eugenie married Antoine Kennedy, the second witness was Frederick Kennedy who was listed as the "father of the groom."

Eugenie Kennedy applied for Half-breed Scrip as an heir to her deceased husband, Joseph Larivière. Joseph, the son of David Larivière and Marie Durocher, was born at Dore (Doré) Lake in December of 1876. Eugenie's Half-breed Scrip application claimed that Joseph had died in 1898 at Dore Lake. Joseph had a brother, Magloire, who died at Dore Lake a year later in 1899.

Eugenie and Antoine Kennedy had several children, some of them died at a young age. Georgine Kennedy was born on November 3, 1900 and was baptized on

the same day, which suggests that she may have died.

Stanislas or "Stanley" Kennedy was the second child. He was born on February 19, 1902. He married Elizabeth "Betsy" Roy, the daughter of Gilbert Roy and Flora Sinclair of Green Lake. Stanley and Besty had several children, and their descendants are still found in Green Lake. Stanley died in Green Lake in 1974 at the age of 72. Elizabeth was 90-years-old when she died on January 13, 2000 and was buried in Green Lake as well.

Mary Kennedy was Eugenie's third child. She was born in 1904 and died in 1916 at the age of 12 and was buried in Green Lake. Both Mary and her mother Eugenie died in 1916.

Melanie (Bella) was born in 1906. Bella married Max Fiddler of Meadow Lake. They had five children. The oldest, Evelyn had eleven children. Max and Bella were separated for many years before they died. Max died in October of 1982 and was buried in Meadow Lake. Bella died in 1996 and was buried in Green Lake.

Emile Kennedy was a Christmas baby, born on December 25, 1908. Emile married Delma Villeneuve from the North Battleford area, and they raised their family in Meadow Lake. Descendants of Emile and Delma are still found in Meadow Lake. Emile died in 1989 and Delma in 1998, both were buried in Meadow Lake.

Baptiste Kennedy was born in 1912 and married Ernestine Roy of Beauval. Baptiste died in 1981 or 1982 and was buried in Beauval. Ernestine died in 1977 and was also buried in Beauval. Ernestine had two children previous to marrying Baptiste: Beatrice Paramuschak of Meadow Lake, who died in April of 2008 and Ambroise (Bullet) who died in 2004 or 2005.

Alice was Antoine and Eugenie Kennedy's last child. She married Ted Gervais, and they had several children together. Alice died in 1946 and was buried in Meadow Lake, where she was buried as Alice "Jarvis." There is a Theodore William Gervais who was buried in Meadow Lake in 1990. He was most likely Alice's husband Ted.

ANTOINE MORIN

Antoine was the third child of Jean Baptiste Morin and Marie Desjarlais. According to his Half-breed Scrip application, he was born on December 8, 1881. Little information on Antoine is available other than his Scrip application and his listing in the 1891 Census. Oral history indicates that Antoine Morin eventually married and lived in the Chitek Lake, Saskatchewan area.

HERMÉNÉGILDE / EIMUNE MORIN

Jean Baptiste Morin's next child was a son named Herménégilde who may have been known as "Eimune." He was listed in the 1901 Green Lake Census as "Eimund." With many unclear archival and genealogical records, it is often difficult to distinguish one person from another, especially when so many popular names were used.

The 1906 Census indicates that Herménégilde was 26-years-old and his wife, Clara, 18. Other records support this census information by indicating that Herménégilde and Clara were married in Green Lake.

Cyprien Morin had an older brother named Antoine Morin Jr. who also had a grandson named Herménégilde whom married Isabel Bird. This family moved east;

however, it is unclear if this Herménégilde Morin was involved with any of the Green Lake and Meadow Lake marriages.

A young woman who died at 25 years of age is also recorded as being married to a Herménégilde Morin. Her name was Marianne Bear. She was born in 1888 and was possibly a daughter of James Bear of the Flying Dust Reserve. Herménégilde and Marianne had a son named Abel who was only four-months-old when he passed away on March 1, 1913. After Marianne's death, Herménégilde married Françoise Merasty, the daughter of Baptiste Merasty and Lucia Maurice of Sled Lake. Françoise was born in 1888. There are no records of Herménégilde having any descendents. He was buried in Meadow Lake Woodlawn Cemetery on May 22, 1954.

EUGENE MORIN

Eugene was the fifth child and the fourth son of Jean Baptiste and Marie Morin. When the 1891 Census was taken, a four-year old boy named "Jean" was listed as living in Jean Baptiste Morin's household. However, this name does not appear in the 1901 Census. On July 12, 1900, Jean Baptiste made a Half-breed Scrip application for his deceased son Eugene, who was born in 1885 at Devil's Lake, but died in 1892. On this Scrip application, Jean Baptiste lists himself as Eugene's sole heir, and his father, Cyprien Morin, appeared as a witness to support his claim. When asked if he knew the deceased child, Cyprien answered, "Yes, he was my grandson," also adding, "My grandchild died at Meadow Lake at about the age of seven years. I was there when he died and I dressed the body up for burial."

ERNEST MORIN

The sixth child of Jean Baptiste Morin and Marie Desjarlais was Ernest ("Eno") Morin. When the 1901 Census was taken at Green

Lake, it was recorded that Ernest was born on October 18, 1887. However, his baptismal certificate indicates that he was born on October 15.

Ernest married Marie Agnès DeLaronde, a sister to Charles and Étienne DeLaronde. Marie Agnès, Charles and Étienne were the children of Paul DeLaronde Jr. and Philomène Morin. Ernest lived in the Island Hill district with his family for many years. Some of his descendents, including his son Emile Morin, continue to live in the same district.

EMILE MORIN

Emile Morin was the last child of Jean Baptiste Morin and Marie Desjarlais. He should not to be confused with his nephew Emile, son of his brother Ernest. Emile married Marie Adèle Fiddler, Jean Baptiste Fiddler's and Veronica Gervais's daughter. Information on Emile Morin was shared by his daughter Bertha Ouellette via his baptismal certificate. Emile was born in November 1889 but was not baptized until August, 1890. This delay might be due to the death of Jean Baptiste's first wife and his marriage to his second wife, Marie Margaret Aubichon.

JEAN BAPTISTE AND MARGARET (AUBICHON) MORIN

Jean Baptiste's and Margaret Marie Aubichon's marriage was the fourth one that took place in Green Lake in 1890. Margaret was the daughter of Baptiste Aubichon Sr. and Philomène Gerard. Jean Baptiste and Margaret had six children together. When the 1891 Census was conducted, all of Jean Baptiste Morin's children were from his first marriage, and none were from his new bride, Margaret Aubichon. On her Half-breed Scrip application, Margaret claimed that she was born in February 1873 at Green Lake and was Jean Baptiste Morin's wife. The head of the first household listed in the 1901 Meadow Lake Census, Mathais Aubichon was Margaret's older brother.

MARGARET MORIN

Named after her mother, Margaret was the first child of Jean Baptiste's new marriage. According to the Green Lake Church records, Margaret Marie was born on February 20, 1892. Only her name and age (nine years) was listed in the 1901 Census.

JOSEPH ONÉSIME MORIN

Joseph Onésime Morin, known most often as "Oneseime," was Jean Baptiste's first son with Margaret Aubichon. On July 5, 1906, when the census was taken in Meadow Lake, Cyprien Morin and his wife Marie had three grandsons living with them. They were Emile, 17, Onésime, 10, and Hyacinthe, five. These three boys were sons of Jean Baptiste Morin who had died in 1903.

Onésime married Elise DeLaronde, a first cousin to Marie Agnès DeLaronde who married Onésime's half-brother Ernest. Onésime and Elise had several children, including Jules Morin who married Virginia Aubichon, a daughter of Théophile Aubichon and Augustine Morin. Onésime lived in North Battleford in his later years. His obituary shows his date of birth as December 23, 1893. He passed away on July 23, 1984 and was buried in Meadow Lake Woodlawn Cemetery. Onésime's descendants are still living in the Meadow Lake area.

Celina was Jean Baptiste Morin's third daughter. When the 1901 Census was taken at Green Lake, she was the youngest member of Jean Baptiste's household. Celina married Charles DeLaronde, Marie Agnès's brother, who was the wife of Celina's brother Ernest. Celina and Charles raised their family in the Meadow Lake area, where many of their descendants continue to live. Celina was buried in Meadow Lake on February 19, 1964. Her husband Charles, who was almost 100-years-old when he died, was buried in Meadow Lake as well on May 25, 1987.

PETER HYACINTHE MORIN

Hyacinthe was probably the name that was used most often for the youngest son of Jean Baptiste and Margaret Morin. Hyacinthe was raised by his grandfather, Cyprien Morin after the death of his father, and was living in Cyprien's household when the 1906 Census was conducted. Hyacinthe enlisted in the Army during WWI; however, his grandfather Cyprien asked for his release as he was underage. Apparently after his release, he enlisted again but did not serve overseas. Hyacinthe married Maria Laboucane. They had a son named Roy who was born in 1930.

According to the St. Cyprien Cemetery records, Peter Hyacinthe died on January 14, 1933. These records incorrectly list him as being 45 years of age. This information would be for his first cousin, Peter Hyacinthe, Pierre Cyprien Morin's son. At the time of his death, Hyacinthe would have been 31 years of age since his birthday was May 17, 1901, according to Green Lake Church records. Hyacinthe died in a shooting incident when he was young. Therefore, his son Roy never knew him, much as Hyacinthe never really knew his father, Jean Baptiste.

ALBERTINE (MORIN) LALIBERTE

Albertine Velina Morin was Jean Baptiste Morin's last child. According to Green Lake church records, she was born on February 16, 1902 and was baptized June 15, 1903. Albertine had several children, some of whom are still living in Green Lake. After the death of her father, Albertine's mother, Margaret Aubichon remarried in 1905 to Norbert Fraser.

Norbert and Margaret had five births recorded with the Green Lake Catholic Church. One of these was Isabel who married Alex Bishop. Another daughter, Exilia married Louis Fiddler of Meadow Lake. The other three children were buried in the Green Lake Cemetery having only reached the age



of one month in all three cases. A fourth child was buried after living for only fifteen days.

PIERRE CYPRIEN MORIN

Pierre Cyprien was Cyprien Morin's and Marie Cook's second oldest living son. He was born on September 6, 1859 at Île-à-la-Crosse, as indicated on his Half-breed Scrip application.

Pierre Cyprien was married twice. His first wife, according to his Half-breed scrip application, was Véronique Chatelaine. In the 1880 church record, Véronique's last name was listed as Siyakikwaniw. His second wife was Marie Miamoo (Miamow). Some records confuse Pierre Cyprien Morin and his wife Marie Miamow with Cyprien Morin and Marie Cook. The spelling of Pierre's wife's surname is Miamow but it is pronounced "Miamoo."

Pierre Cyprien had an uncle named Pierre Morin as well as three first cousins named Pierre: Pierre-Marie who was the son of Raphaël Morin Sr., Pierre Zephyrin who was the son of Zephyrin Morin, and Antoine Morin Jr.'s son Pierre.

When Pierre Cyprien applied for Half-breed Scrip, he indicated that he was married to Véronique on March 4, 1880, and that he had three living children: Joachim, Lucie, and Paul.

When the 1881 Green Lake Census was taken, Pierre Cyprien and Véronique did not have any children. Ten years later in the 1891 Census, they had five children. The oldest was Joseph aged 9, most likely referred to as "Joachim" on the Half-breed Scrip application; followed by 7-year-old Lucie, 5-year-old Paul, 3-year-old Marie, and seven-month old Margaret.

The 1901 Meadow Lake Census indicates that Pierre was living with his second wife Marie Miamoo. Therefore, somewhere between 1891 and 1901 Véronique passed away. In the 1891 Census, Miamoo was referred to as "Margaret," at other times she is referred to as "Marie." The census lists three children living with Pierre and Miamoo: Paul, Margaret Marie, and Jean Marie.

Pierre Cyprien Morin passed away on January 5, 1932 and was buried in the St. Cyprien Cemetery. Alex DeLaronde recalled picking berries with Pierre Cyprien and his family. Pierre Cyprien and his wife rode in one wagon while Alex rode with his cousin Margaret "*Wah-Zoo*" in another wagon.

PIERRE CYPRIEN MORIN'S CHILDREN

The following were children of Pierre Cyprien Morin and his first wife Véronique Chatelaine:

(1) Joachim or Joseph was Pierre Cyprien's oldest child. No further information was found on him.

(2) Lucie Morin married Mathias Aubichon of Green Lake in 1901. On June 26, 1902, a two-month old child named Delphine was baptized in Green Lake. In 1919, a 19-year-old Delphine Merasty was buried in Green Lake. It is unclear whether or not this young woman was Lucie's and Mathias' daughter. Lucie passed away prior to 1905, because in June 1906 another child of Mathias Aubichon was baptized at Green Lake. The mother was recorded as Rosa McCallum of Green Lake.

(3) Paul married Caroline Matchee from the Flying Dust Reserve, likely after he served in the Canadian Expeditionary Force in WWI. Caroline was the daughter of Michel Matchee and Madeline Bear, and a sister to Alex Matchee. Some Matchees also used Leblanc as a surname. On May 25, 1911, when the first Catholic confirmation was held in Meadow Lake, Caroline Matchee was one of the recipients. Therefore, their marriage would have taken place after this date.

Paul and Caroline had a son named George (Baldy) Morin. However, from 1914 to 1927, Caroline and Paul Morin lost six children as infants. They were all buried in the St. Cyprien Cemetery. No information was found indicating when Paul or Caroline passed away. However, there was

a Caroline Morin who was buried in 1977 in Meadow Lake's Woodlawn Cemetery. There was also a George Morin buried in the same cemetery in 1976 who could be their son.

(4) Margaret Marie was most likely also known as "Wah-Zoo." Alex DeLaronde recalled when Margaret's father Pierre Cyprien died she inherited his cattle.

The following two children are from Pierre Cyprien's and Marie Miamoo's marriage:

(5) Pierre was born on Friday July 13, 1894 and was baptized in Green Lake. No further information for him was found.

(6) Jean Marie was born on November 27, 1897. Jean Marie also had an uncle by the same name. Jean Marie, Pierre Cyprien's son, married Angélique Lafond, and had one child that listed in the record. This whole family died in November 1918. They were buried in the St. Cyprien Cemetery. Jean Marie passed away on November 5 at 22 years of age, the baby Joseph Pierre on November 6, and Angélique on November 21 at 23 years of age.

PÉLAGIE (MORIN) MALBOEUF

Pélagie Morin was Pierre Cyprien Morin's and Marie Cook's oldest daughter. She married Pierre Malboeuf Jr, an Île-à-la-Crosse man. Pélagie and Pierre lived in the Meadow Lake and Green Lake areas for several years, eventually moving to Île-à-la-Crosse, where they were living when the 1901 Census was taken.

Six of their children were baptized at Green Lake from 1878 to 1894. They were Léon Pie, 1878, Valérie, 1881, Clementine, 1885, Daniel, 1889, Elmiere, 1890, Marie Agnès, 1893, and Adelaide, 1894. All the children were born at Île-à-la-Crosse except Clementine who was born at Devil's Lake according to census information.

Pélagie Morin had three first cousins

with the same first and last name. One of these cousins was the daughter of Zephyrin Morin and Madeleine Girard whom later married Angus McLeod. This couple did not stay together; however, they had children, one of whom was John ("Tchi Jean") Merasty of Green Lake. Another first cousin was Louis Morin's and Marguerite Jourdain's daughter. This Pélagie married Célestin Merasty of Green Lake and had several children, one of whom was Julie Bell of Rush Lake. Pélagie (Morin) Merasty died in 1953, and was buried in Green Lake. The third cousin was Raphaël Morin's and Betsy Cook's daughter. It is unclear if she ever married. She is likely the same Pélagie Morin who was buried in Green Lake in 1928.

The following are Pélagie Morin's and Pierre Malboeuf's children:



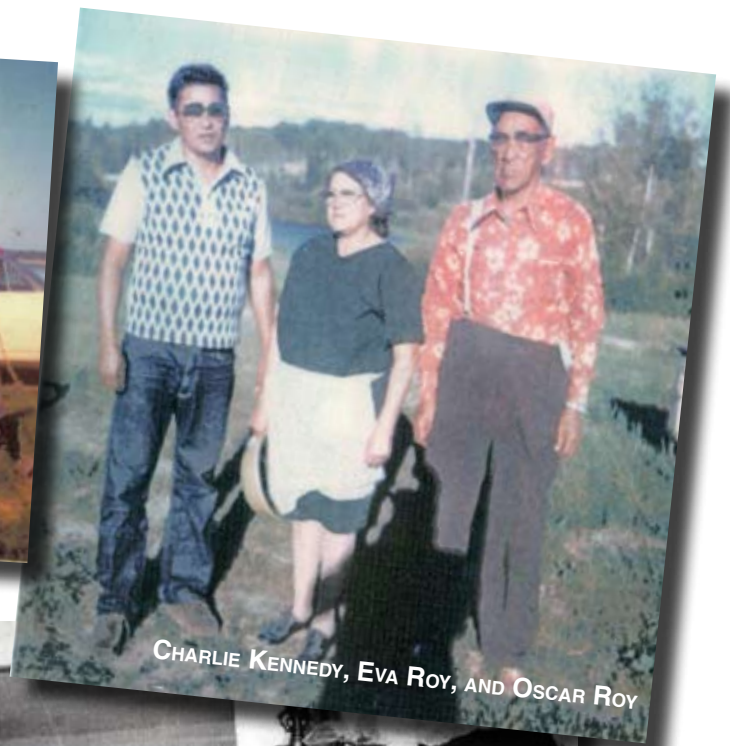

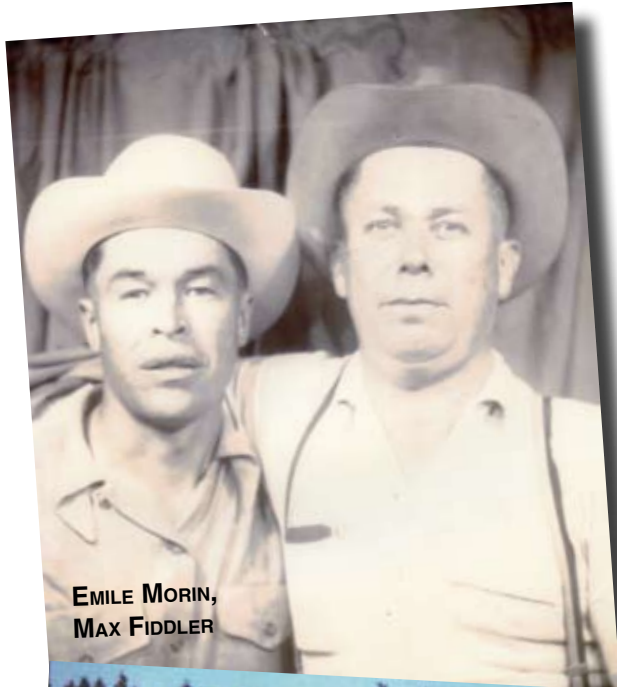
He was the oldest child. According to Half-breed Scrip records, he was born on December 23, 1878 at Green Lake, died on July 23, 1898, and was buried in Green Lake. His wife, Marie Meraste (Meresty), applied for Half-breed Scrip as one of Léon Pie's heirs as did his children, Judile and Basile. Léon and Marie would have been

married at a very young age because he was not yet 20-years-old when he passed away. In later years, Marie was known as “*Marisis*” Laboucane.

It is unknown what became of Basile; however, Judile married Louis McCallum. Louis had a younger brother from Green Lake named Philip McCallum as well as two other brothers named Abraham and Mike. Judile and Louis McCallum have many descendants living in Meadow Lake and area today.

VALERIE (MALBOEUF) DESJARLAIS

Half-breed Scrip records indicate that Valerie Malboeuf married Île-à-la Crosse’s Prosper Desjarlais in 1896. Prosper was the son of Thomas Desjarlais and Marie Lafleur. When the 1901 Île-à-la Crosse Census was taken, Prosper and Valérie Desjarlais had two children, Elise Marie was three-years-old and one-year-old Madeleine Marie. Also, on this census, Meadow Lake was given as Valérie’s birthplace.

When the 1906 Census was taken, two children were included in Prosper’s household: Madeleine who was five-years-old and Clementine who was two-years-old. Elise Desjarlais was found among the names of the pupils listed as attending the St. Jean Baptiste Roman Catholic Mission, which was also known as the “Indian Boarding School.”

Elise Desjarlais married a Billette and had a daughter by the name of Agnès Billette. Agnès is the mother of Martin Benjamin. Madeleine Desjarlais married Joe Montgrand. They had a son named Daniel Montgrand, the father of Antoinette Iron. No information on the daughter, Clementine was found. Hermeline (*Oskiyhs*) married Harry McCallum of Buffalo Narrows, Saskatchewan. The last daughter married Alfred Billette from Dillon, Saskatchewan, and was the mother of Thérèse.

CYPRIEN MALBOEUF

In 1901, Cyprien was living in La Loche, Saskatchewan with his wife Eliza Janvier. Eliza was the daughter of Joseph Janvier

and Adeline Maurice, the daughter of François Maurice Sr. and Angèle Laliberte. When Cyprien and Eliza applied for Half-breed Scrip, they were living at Île-à-la Crosse. The 1906 Île-à-la Crosse Census indicates that the following three children were living in Cyprien’s and Eliza’s household: Léon who was five-years-old, Gregoire (Gregory) was three-years-old and Marie Margaret was six-months-old. When Eliza applied for Half-breed Scrip, she had the names of these three children on her application and had indicated that she married Cyprien in 1900.

Family records show that Cyprien Malboeuf had remarried to Suzanne Kyplain. After Cyprien’s death, Suzanne married Joseph Victor Laliberte.

CLEMENTINE (MALBOEUF) DAIGNEAULT

A Half-breed Scrip application was made by Pierre Malboeuf for his absent daughter Clementine Malboeuf. On this application, her address was listed as Meadow Lake, her birthplace was Devil’s Lake, and her date of birth, May 5, 1885. Clemetine married Pierre Daigneault, of Île-à-la Crosse, son of Vincent Daigneault Sr. and Margaret Bouvier. In his Half-breed Scrip application, Pierre gave 1900 as the year he married; however, the 1901 Census shows both Clementine and Pierre living with their parents and listed as being single. The 1906 Île-à-la Crosse Census lists Clemetine’s and Pierre’s four-month-old daughter, Emilée.

DANIEL MALBOEUF

Daniel married Île-à-la Crosse’s Marie (*Marisis*) Jourdain, the daughter of Jean Baptiste Jourdain Jr. and Anna Bekkatla. Daniel and Marie were the parents of Pélagie Maurice of Beauval. Pélagie married Jacob Maurice, the son of François Maurice Jr. and Josephine Coulineur. Daniel had several other children including Ernestine and Joe.

ELMIRE (MALBOEUF) GARDINER

According to Half-breed Scrip records, Elmire

married William Gardiner, son of Robert Gardiner and Lucie Daigneault, at Île-à-la-Crosse in 1905. Monique, a niece of Elmire, also married another William Gardiner—a nephew to Elmire’s husband William.

ADELAIDE (MALBOEUF) ROY

Adelaide married Isidore Roy, the son of Louison Roy and Couronne Maurice of Île-à-la-Crosse. Mary Desjarlais of Buffalo Narrows, who was married to Ernest Desjarlais, was Adelaide’s daughter.

• • •

The following are the names of Pierre and Pélagie Malboeuf’s children when the 1901 Île-à-la-Crosse Census was taken: Marie Agnès, Adelaide, Couronne, and Elise (entered as a boy). The last two were both one-years-old. In 1906, Couronne was the same age as a girl whose name appears to be Emiliée. Catholic Church records for Île-à-la-Crosse show that Couronne and Exilia Malboeuf, daughters of Pierre Malboeuf Jr. and Pélagie Morin, were born in 1901. Couronne married Ambroise Kiezie, and Exilia married Joseph Maurice. It appears that the enumerator for the 1901 Île-à-la-Crosse Census made a mistake when entering the boy Elise. Exilia should have been entered instead. Marie Agnès married George Kyplain.

JOSEPH MORIN

When Pierre Cyprien Morin applied for Half-breed Scrip, his son Joseph was 21. Pierre Cyprien indicated that his son was born at Green Lake’s south end. On Joseph’s baptismal certificate, the baptismal date was May 19, 1868 and his birth date, at Île-à-la-Crosse, was January 24, 1868. The Charles C. Denney fonds lists October 3, 1884 as Joseph Morin’s and Pélagie Linklater’s wedding date. Pélagie was Peter Linklater’s and Marie Morin’s daughter. When Pélagie passed away on April 4, 1922, her age was not recorded at the St. Cyprien Cemetery. Some information

may list Linklater as “Lecklinker” due to information passed down verbally.

When the 1891 Census was taken at Green Lake, in April, it shows that Joseph and Pélagie were living in the household of his brother Pierre Cyprien Morin and his family. At the time, Pélagie was 22 years of age, which gives her an approximate birth year of 1869. At the time of her death, she would have been about 53-years-old.

Also listed in the 1891 Census was Joseph’s two-year-old daughter, Octavie and a one-month-old son, Henri. Charles C. Denney’s fonds indicate that Norbert was born in May 1891. It is possible that Henri and Norbert was the same person. Norbert married Florence Fiddler, a sister to William John Fiddler.

The 1901 Meadow Lake Census indicates that Joseph and Pélagie had four children. Henri (or Norbert) was the oldest at 11-years-old, Augustine, nine years, Christine, six, and Marie, four. Also in this census, Pélagie was entered as “Elesie” or something similar.

The 1906 Census lists Joseph’s and Pélagie’s seven children: Norbert, Augustine, Christine, Marie Ange, Cyril, Léon, and Judile.

The following children of Joseph Morin and Pélagie Linklater were baptized in Green Lake: Alexandre, 1888, Marie Octavie, 1889, Ignace, 1893, Augustine, 1893, Christine, 1895, Marie Ange, 1897, Rosalie, 1898, Elsie, 1901, Cyril, 1902, Léon, 1904, and Judile, 1906. Ignace may have been Augustine’s twin.

NORBERT MORIN

Norbert was Joseph Morin’s oldest living child. Norbert married Florence Fiddler, Jean Baptiste Fiddler’s and Veronica Gervais’ daughter prior to 1918. Their first child, Edwin was born in 1918 and their last child, Lillian was born in 1940. Norbert and Florence had eight living children and fifty-three grandchildren. The first grandchild was born in 1948. Norbert likely died in 1967 and was buried in Meadow Lake. However,

the Woodlawn Cemetery listing indicates that Norbert was buried in 1962. Therefore, his proper date of death remains unclear. Florence died in Vancouver in 1986 and was buried on August 9, 1986 in Meadow Lake's Woodlawn Cemetery.

AUGUSTINE (MORIN) AUBICHON

Augustine Morin, Joseph's daughter, married Théophile Aubichon in 1909 in Green Lake. At that time, Augustine would have been about 16. Théophile was from Green Lake and was the son of Baptiste Aubichon Sr. and Philomène Girard. Augustine and Théophile had sixteen children. Many of their descendants live in the Meadow Lake area. Some information on the family was provided to the *Meadow River School District Heritage Book* by the late Emile Aubichon.

Augustine contracted tuberculosis in 1936 and was in the Prince Albert Sanatorium for five years before she died there in May 1941. She would have been 43-years-old at the time of her death. In 1945, Théophile remarried to Marie Louise (Ducharme) Morin, widow of the late Ambroise Morin. Théophile lived in Meadow Lake until his passing in 1961 where he was buried in the Woodlawn Cemetery on February 25, 1961.

CHRISTINE (MORIN) DUROCHER

Christine was born at Green Lake in June 1895 and was baptized on August 5 of that year. In 1910, Christine married her first husband, Green Lake's Julien Laliberte, son of Pierre Laliberte Jr. and Geneviève Jourdain. Julien and Christine had three children. Their first child was a son, Léon Grégoire who was baptized on November 18, 1910. In 1912, a two-year-old boy was buried in Green Lake by the name of Grégoire Laliberte.

Christine's and Julien's next child was a daughter named Rosa. In 1931, Rosa married Joe Landry. Many of their descendants still live in Meadow Lake. Rosa was buried in the Woodlawn Cemetery in Meadow Lake. Her funeral was March 25, 1974.

Their last child was Gabe. In the 1940s, Gabe married Margaret Fiddler (née Laboucane), a widow. Margaret had been married to Fred Fiddler, a brother of Theodore (*Mushkaygaw*) Fiddler. Margaret had seven children from her first marriage and three from her marriage to Gabe. The names of the three (Gabe) Laliberte

children are: Delores, she died at the age of two when the house burned down in approximately 1956; Robert who lives in Vancouver; and Darlene who is married to a Dyck.

Julien Laliberte, Christine Morin's first husband died in 1914 at 30 years of age and was buried in the Green Lake Cemetery. His brother Pierre died that same year at the age of 22 and was also buried in the Green Lake Cemetery.

After the death of her first husband, Christine married Daniel Durocher from the Flying Dust Reserve. Christine and Dan had several children and have many descendants living in the Meadow Lake area and on the Flying Dust First Nation. Both Daniel and Christine were buried in the Flying Dust Cemetery. Their gravestones indicate that they lived from 1884-1974 and 1894-1972, respectively.

MARIE ANGE (MORIN) FIDDLER

Marie Ange was born to Joseph and Pélagie Morin on April 18, 1897 and was baptized on May 3rd of that same year in Green Lake. Prior to 1920, Marie Ange married Theodore "Mushkaygaw" Fiddler, Baptiste Fiddler's and Veronica Gervais's son. He was also a brother to Florence Fiddler who was married

to Marie Ange's brother, Norbert Morin. Marie Ange and Theodore lived on the Waterhen Reserve.

Marie Ange and Theodore had nine children. The first child, Norbert was born in 1917, and the last child, Edward was born in 1939. The date of Marie Agne's death is unclear. Many oral histories say 1940 or 1941 as her sister and father passed away near the same time. They were possibly buried in the Flying Dust Cemetery. After Marie Ange's death, Theodore married Bernadette Opekokew. They had four children together, the last born in 1952.

CYRIL MORIN

Cyril was born on October 11, 1902 and was baptized the next day.

LÉON MORIN

Léon Morin was born in 1904. He was four-days-old when he was baptized on August 21 at Green Lake. Léon's Godparents were Louis and Marguerite Morin (née Jourdain). Louis was Cyprien Morin's younger brother. Léon married Virginia Laliberte from Green Lake, the daughter of John (Halfway) Laliberte and Elise Durocher.

Léon and Virginia had ten children, including a set of twins. Many of their descendants live in the Meadow Lake and Green Lake areas. Léon passed away on June 8th in 1989 and was buried at Green Lake. Virginia passed away June 4, 2002 and was also buried in the Green Lake Cemetery. Virginia's obituary card shows that she had six daughters and four sons. Both Léon and Virginia predeceased all of their children.

JUDILE (MORIN) MARTELL

Judile was the youngest of the children. Her obituary card shows her birth date as December 10, 1905. On December 22, 1987, she passed away in Meadow Lake and was laid to rest in the Waterhen Lake First Nation cemetery. Judile married Bruno Martell. They lived on Waterhen Lake First Nation. Bruno and Judile had several children, including Marcel who continues to live on the Waterhen Lake First Nation.

JEAN MARIE MORIN

On his Half-breed Scrip application, Jean Marie claims that he was born on April 6, 1873 at Île-à-la-Crosse. Many confuse Jean Marie with his nephew of the same name born in 1897. The third wedding that took place in Green Lake in 1890 was that of Jean Marie and Marguerite (Margaret) Flammand. Marguerite was the daughter of Olivier Flammand and Helen Malaterre and a sister to Sam Flammand. On her Half-breed Scrip application, Marguerite indicated that she was born March 30, 1868 at Fort Ellice (in what is now west-central Manitoba).

CATHERINE (MORIN) SINCLAIR

From 1891 to 1903, Jean Marie and Marguerite had Bernadette, Ambroise, Édouard, Adèle, Gaspard, and August baptized in the Green Lake Church. Another child, Philomène, was said to have been born in Montana.

According to the St. Cyprien Cemetery record, Jean Marie lost his first wife in 1922 in Meadow Lake. Marguerite passed away February 5, 1922 at the age of 54.

It is not known when Jean Marie married Green Lake's Catherine Sinclair, widow of George Sinclair. George passed away in 1918, and was buried in the Green Lake Cemetery. Catherine was Frederick Kennedy's and Josephine Jourdain's daughter. Jean Marie lived with Catherine in Green Lake until 1935, when he passed away at 62 years of age. Jean Marie was buried at Green Lake. Catherine Kennedy Morin lived in Green Lake until 1974 when she too passed away. She was also buried at Green Lake.

BERNADETTE (MORIN) MURRAY

The Green Lake Church record indicates that Bernadette Morin was born on July 30, 1891. Jack Murray and Bernadette Morin were married in March 1910 according to the information provided by their daughter, Mary Gehl. Bernadette and Jack raised their large family in Meadow Lake, where many of their descendants continue to live.

AMBROISE MORIN

According to Church records, Ambroise was born on June 18, 1893. He married Marie Louise Ducharme, the daughter of Albert Ducharme and Sarah Jane Scott. The date of Ambroise's death is unknown, although it would have been prior to 1945 since Marie Louise Morin married Théophile Aubichon on April 9, 1945. Marie Louise was buried in Meadow Lake's Woodlawn Cemetery on October 15, 1991.

PHILOMÈNE (MORIN) NAULT

The Meadow River School District Heritage Book has a brief history on Philomène and her husband Louis Nault. It indicates that she was born in Montana and was married by Father Cochin on May 2, 1910. The names of all their children were also entered in the book with the oldest Ernest, born in 1915. On March 17, 1934 Louis passed away from a heart attack and was buried at the age of 49, in the St. Cyprien Cemetery. Philomène died in 1941 at the age of 49 in the Prince Albert sanitarium. On January 14, 1941, she was buried in the Woodlawn Cemetery.

EDWARD MORIN

Edward was born on April 20, 1897 and was baptized in Green Lake on May 5, 1897. Edward's niece claims he died in 1917 at Scott, Saskatchewan where he went south for the harvest.

ADÈLE (MORIN) CHATELAINE

Marie Adèle Morin was born on May 5, 1899 and was baptized on June 20 of that same

year. Adèle or “Dzeewow” married Louis Chatelaine. Louis submitted family history to the Meadow River and Meadow Lake heritage books where he indicated that he and Marie Adèle had eight children. No information on when Marie Adèle passed away is available; however, there is a Mary Chatelaine who was buried on August 24, 1965 in the Woodlawn Cemetery. Louis Chatelaine was also buried there on May 30, 1986.

GASPARD MORIN

Gaspard Morin was baptized on December 29, 1901 at 3½ months. He married Maria Piché, originally from Willow Bunch, Saskatchewan, and a daughter to Zachary Piché. Gaspard died in 1970 and was buried on March 19 in the Woodlawn Cemetery. A Maria Morin was buried in Meadow Lake on January 30, 1976.

AUGUST MORIN

August Morin, also known as “Duke,” was born on October 1, 1903 and was baptized December 31, 1903. Very little information is available about him. There was, however, an August Morin buried in Meadow Lake on January 21, 1971.

MARIE AGNÈS (MORIN) DELARONDE

Marie Agnès Morin was the youngest daughter of Pierre Cyprien and Marie Morin. Pierre Cyprien had two children recorded in the Green Lake baptismal record, the first being Marie Agnès. These records show that Marie Agnès was born in 1875 and that she was baptized on December 2 of that same year.

The first wedding that took place in the Green Lake Catholic Church in 1894 was that of Agnès Morin and William DeLaronde, born in 1870. William and Agnès had five girls and two boys. The names of their children, as they appear in the Green Lake Catholic Church record, were: Elise, Velina, Clara Mathilde, Marie Rose, Julienne Catherine, and Joachim William. Another child named George, who was also known as “Zachary,” was not on

this list as he was the last to be born before his father died.

William DeLaronde died October 24, 1909 in Meadow Lake. At the time of his death, he was 39-years-old according to the St. Cyprien Cemetery record. In his Half-breed Scrip application, William provided June 26, 1874 as his date of birth rather than 1870. His parents were recorded as Paul DeLaronde and Margaret Sinclair. William also added that he was born in Water Hen River, Manitoba. Marie Agnès's Scrip application also provided more information including December 2, 1875 as her date of birth, and Green Lake as her place of birth. William and Marie Agnès both received 240 acres for their Scrip applications.

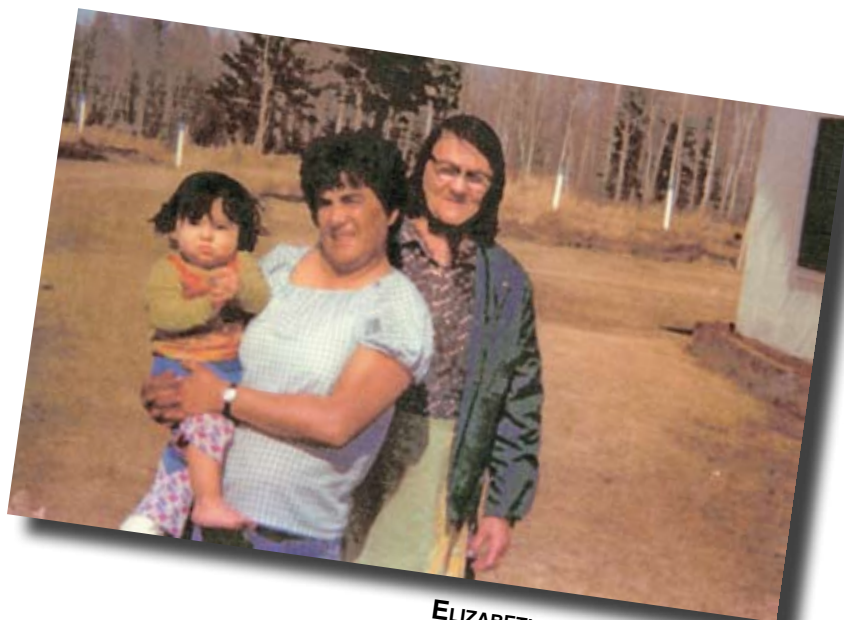
Some years after William's death in 1909, Agnès married Antoine Kennedy of Green Lake, who had been widowed in 1916. No date is available for when they were married but they had one child by the name of Eva, also known as "Dsi-Dsin," who was born in 1919 or 1920. Eva married John Roy of Green Lake.

Marie Agnès passed away on September 24, 1931 and was buried in the St. Cyprien Cemetery. Marie Agnès donated a piece of land for the St. Cyprien Cemetery when her husband died in 1909, making her husband the first person to be buried there.

After Marie Agnès Morin Kennedy's death, her second husband, Antoine Kennedy moved back to his hometown of Green Lake. All the property of his second marriage was left behind for the family of his late wife, Marie Agnès. Antoine died in Green Lake in 1944 at the age of 64 and was buried in the Green Lake Cemetery.

Elizabeth Kennedy, who was married to Stanley, Antoine's oldest son by his first marriage, recalls that Antoine became very ill when they were trapping muskrats west of Green Lake. When Antoine became sick, Elizabeth was unable to contact anyone else and her husband Stanley was out trapping. She therefore pulled Antoine to Green Lake on a toboggan as he was too sick to walk.

The following are the children of Marie Agnès Morin and her first husband, William DeLaronde:

ELISE (DELARONDE) MORIN

Elise, the oldest girl, appears in the Green Lake Church record. She was born on September 27, 1895 and was baptized on October 15. Elise married Joseph Onésime Morin, and in October of 1913, their daughter, Marie Victoria was born. Marie Victoria died on January 17, 1914. Elise and Joseph Onésime also had several other children. Elise was buried in Meadow Lake on June 2, 1965. On July 23, 1984, Joseph Onésime passed away in North Battleford and was also buried in the Meadow Lake Cemetery.

VELINA (DELARONDE) FIDDLER

Velina, the second daughter, was known as “Avelina” in the 1901 Meadow Lake Census. She also had the nickname “*Pi-tsi-tsah*.” In the Woodlawn Cemetery listing, her name is recorded as Avelina Fiddler. Velina married William Fiddler on August 11, 1911. They had 13 children over a 27-year period (1912–1939), only one of whom died, four-year-old Meralda in 1937. She was buried in the St. Cyprien Cemetery.

Velina lived in Meadow Lake for most of her life until she passed away in 1978 and was buried in the Meadow Lake Cemetery on May 19. Her husband, William John Fiddler passed away in 1972 and was also buried in Meadow Lake’s Woodlawn Cemetery with his funeral taking place September 7.

CLARA / CLARISSE (DELARONDE) SPRINGSTEAD

Clara was baptized in Green Lake on December 26, 1899 at the age of three months. The Meadow Lake Catholic Church published a 75th anniversary record of different events that took place in the Our Lady of Peace Roman Catholic parish. The first funeral to be held in that church was that of Clara’s father, William DeLaronde. The first communion in 1909 had twenty participants: one of these was Elise DeLaronde, Clara’s sister. The first confirmation took place in 1911, where Clara, along with her mother Agnès and



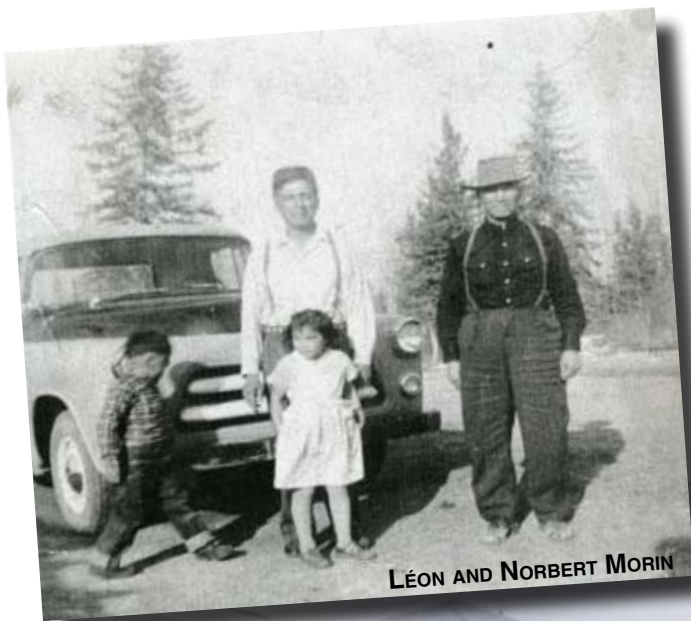

sisters, Marie Rose and Elise and brother, Joachim were confirmed.

Clara married twice. Her first husband was Joe “*Joe-Kin*” Nault who died in 1942 at the age of 57 years. He was buried in the Meadow Lake Woodlawn Cemetery on November 1, 1942. Clara and Joe did not have any children. After the death of her first husband, Clara married David Springstead, and they continued to live in Meadow Lake. No information as to whether or not Clara had any children was found. In 1972, Clara Springstead was buried in the Woodlawn Cemetery at Meadow Lake. In 1978, David Springstead was also buried there.

MARIE ROSE (DELARONDE) BOYER

Marie Rose, also known as “*Lou-loose*,” lived in Meadow Lake and was married to Ambroise Boyer. Family history tells us that Marie Rose and her twins died while in childbirth. Our Lady of Peace Roman Catholic Church in Meadow Lake has information in their records concerning Marie Rose Boyer’s and her baby twins’ funeral in October 1937 as well as their burial date of October 21, 1937. Her age was listed as 27, but she would have been 36-years-old. Her baptismal information

from the Green Lake Catholic Church record indicated that “Marie Rose Laronde” was one-month-old when she was baptized on December 29, 1901. Marie Rose was buried in Meadow Lake at the St. Cyprien Cemetery.

Alex DeLaronde recalls that his father Charles DeLaronde had worked with Ambroise Boyer in 1917 for a rancher named Crew. Alex also recalls that after the death of Marie Rose, Ambroise continued to live in the Meadow Lake area for several years, and that Marie Rose and Ambroise had a two-story house on the hill where the golf course is presently located in Meadow Lake.

Lake Catholic registry lists his birth date as March 22, 1904. When the 1906 Census was taken, William Laronde’s household was entered right after that of Cyprien Morin. The youngest child at the time was Joachim William at two years of age. Josh was well known in Meadow Lake and in the surrounding area for his involvement in chuckwagon races during the annual Meadow Lake Stampede. Josh married Marie Piché, who was the daughter of Zachary Piché of the Willow Bunch district. Some of their children were: Paul, Raymond, Martin, Mervin, Max, Theresa, Irene, Bertha, Pearl, and Verna.

In May 1966, a lady by the name of Marie DeLaronde was buried in the Woodlawn Cemetery in Meadow Lake. In November of 1975, Joachim William was also buried in that same cemetery.

**JULIENNA / JULIE (DELARONDE)
SANSREGRET**

Julie was the youngest of the DeLaronde girls. When she was baptized in October 1906, the Green Lake Catholic Church registry listed her as two-months old. Julie married Harris Sansregret, and lived in Meadow Lake for many years. Harris was buried in the Meadow Lake Woodlawn Cemetery in June 1981. In March 1991, Julie Sansregret was buried in the same cemetery.

JOACHIM WILLIAM DELARONDE

The first son born to Marie Agnès and William DeLaronde was Joachim who was widely known as “Josh Laronde.” The Green

George was the youngest of the DeLaronde children born prior to the death of his father, William. George was born around 1908, and was known by most people as "Zachary." There is a short history of George DeLaronde in *Heritage Memories: A History of Meadow Lake and Surrounding Districts*, which indicates that he had his own band, and that he built his own guitars and violins. A postcard that was sent from George to his sister Velina has been handed down in the family. The postcard, which was sent from Ontario with a four-cent stamp, features George on the front posing with a violin. George DeLaronde was buried in Meadow Lake on May 1, 1961. When he died, he was approximately 53-years-old.

JÉRÉMIE MORIN

Jérémie was Cyprien Morin's and Marie Cook's youngest child. The Green Lake

Church record has only two baptismal accounts for Cyprien Morin's children. The first of these was for Marie Agnès (DeLaronde) and the second was for Jérémie Morin. Jérémie was baptized on August 5, 1878, having been born on June 20, 1878. When Jérémie was baptized, his Godmother was Marguerite Jourdain, the wife of his uncle, Louis Morin who was Cyprien's younger brother.

Two marriage records for Jérémie were found. His first marriage was on May 5, 1897 to Marie Anastasia Bear at Green Lake. The witnesses for that marriage were Jérémie's father, Cyprien and older brother, Pierre Morin. Father Teston performed the ceremony. Jérémie remarried in 1908, although no date was found for when Marie Anastasia passed away. In the 1906 Census, Jérémie Morin was listed as a widower.

Jérémie Morin married Virginie Laliberte, the daughter of Pierre Laliberte Jr. and Geneviève Jourdain of Green Lake on January 27, 1908. The officiating priest was once again Father Teston and the witnesses were William Laronde and Joseph Morin. William was married to Jérémie's sister and Joseph Morin was Jérémie's older brother.

On January 4, 1915 Jérémie died due to the accidental discharge of a firearm. Jérémie's nephew, Joseph's son, recalls what he was told about this tragedy: Jérémie had just arrived at a New Year's party that was being held in Jean Baptiste Fiddler's home. When Jérémie entered Jean Baptiste's home, he proceeded to hang his jacket on a coat rack which was near the entrance which had a gun hanging on it. The gun dislodged and fell and then discharged a bullet when it hit the floor. According to the late Flora Gladu of the Flying Dust First Nation, Agnès Laronde would not allow her children to celebrate New Year's out of respect and in memory of her brother Jérémie.

After Jérémie's death, his wife Virginie remarried his first cousin, Baptiste

Morin. Baptiste was a son of Raphaël Morin, Cyprien's older brother. Baptiste died in 1942 at the age of 75 and was buried in the Green Lake Cemetery.

Virginie lived for many years after the death of her second husband and died in 1977 at the age of 98. No records have been found indicating that Jérémie or Virginie had any children. However, she raised some children that were not her own: John Quintal, Dick Fulton, and William Morin. William Morin was Pierre-Marie Morin's grandson and her second husband's brother. John Quintal was the son of Olivier Quintal and Louise Bear.

CYPRIEN MORIN'S OTHER CHILDREN

Cyprien Morin also had other children that did not reach adulthood. The names of two children were found in Half-breed Scrip documentation. According to Cyprien's Half-breed Scrip application, he had a son named George Morin. George was born at Île-à-la Crosse on April 27, 1871 and lived in Green Lake in 1877 when he passed away. No records of his burial in the Green Lake Cemetery were found; however, some Green Lake residents were buried at "Halfway," which was approximately halfway between the south end of Green Lake and the settlement of Green Lake. No permanent records were kept for these burials.

Cyprien also had another child named Hermeline for whom he applied for Half-breed Scrip. She was born on October 7, 1880, and only lived for a short time. She was buried in December 1880 at Green Lake where she was also born. This funeral, like that of her brother George, was not recorded in the Green Lake St. Judes Cemetery. Cyprien received \$240 in money Scrip for each of these deceased children.

According to his Scrip application, Cyprien Morin had seven children who were living and four deceased. Question number 10 on the application asked, "How many children do you have living?" to which he replied "seven." In reply to question 11, he

provided the names of his living children and their dates of birth. Baptiste Morin was born in Green Lake, 1856; Pierre Morin who was 28-years-old and was born in Île-à-la Crosse; Pélagie, who was 25½-years-old, was also born in Île-à-la Crosse; Joseph, 21, was born on the south end of Green Lake; Jean Marie was 16; April was born in Île-à-la Crosse; Agnès was 14-years-old and was born Green Lake; and Jérémie was 10-years-old and was born Green Lake.

In question 13, Cyprien was asked, "How many children had you that died?" and his reply was "four." In answer to question 14, Cyprien gave the names of his children that had died and provided the ages for his children had they been alive. Stanislaus would have been 29-years-old if living, was born at Île-à-la Crosse and died before the transfer; William would have been 23-years-old, was born at Lac des Isles and died before he was two; George would have been 19-years-old and was born in Île-à-la Crosse about 1877; and Hermeline died before being christened. Stanislaus would have been younger than Baptiste but older than Pierre; William would have been between Pélagie and Joseph in terms of age; George would have been between Joseph and Jean Marie; and Hermeline would have been the youngest child.

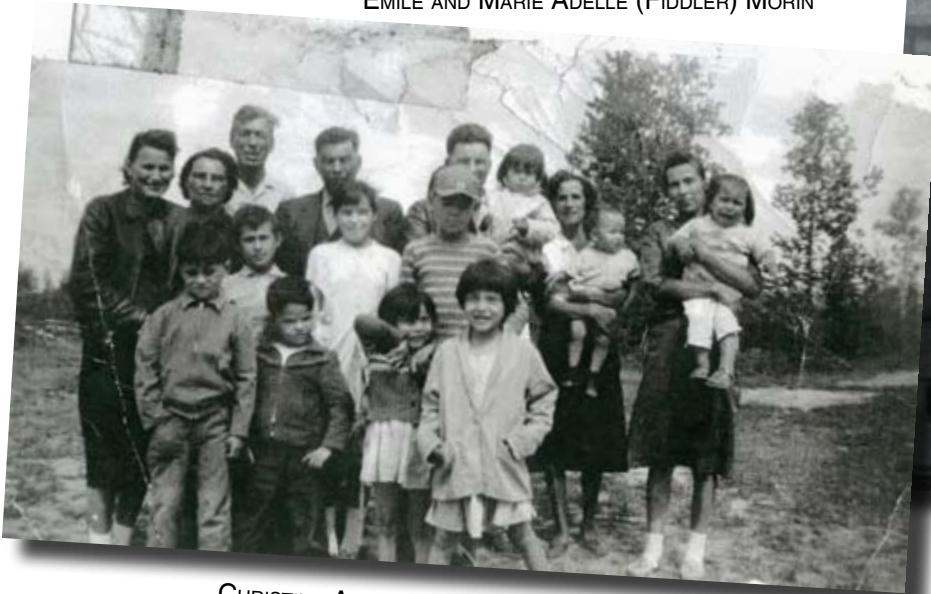
