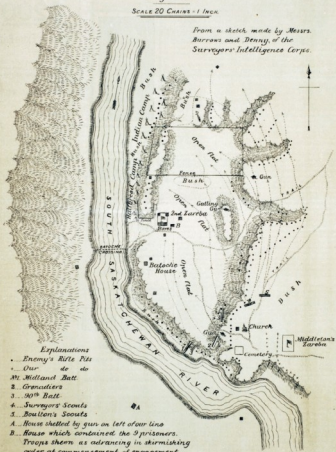


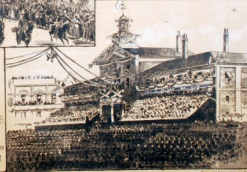

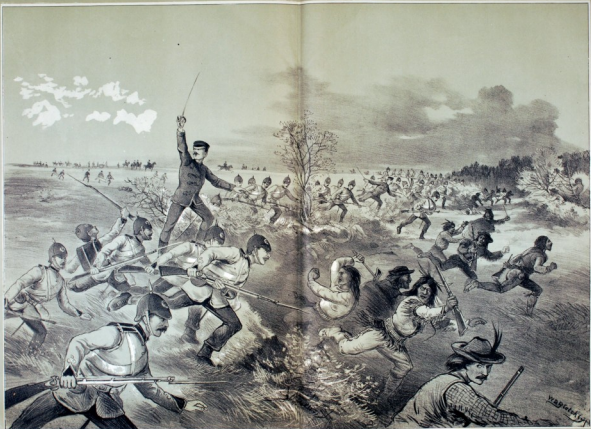






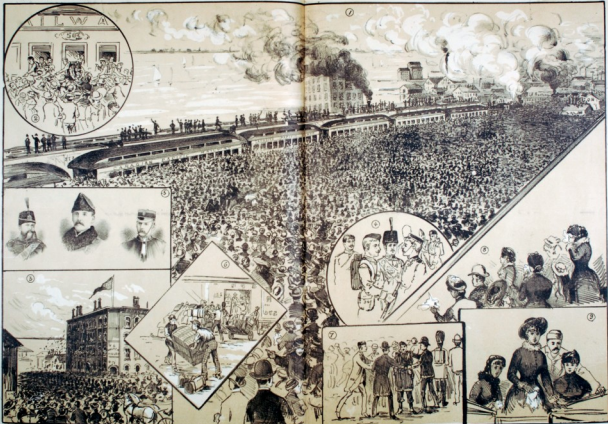






THE BAYONET CHARGE AT BATOCHÉ.
