

Roderick Ross. (b. 1829)

Roderick was a St. Francois Xavier trader, the son of Hugh Ross and Sarah Short. He married Marie Delorme the daughter of Urbain Delorme and Madeleine Vivier. In 1878, Roderick and other Metis buffalo hunters at Cypress Hills wrote a petition asking for a special Metis reserve of land. Their daughter Rose was married to Gregoire Wills (Welsh). Wills (Welsh) also signed the petition for a reserve. He later became a resident at Lebret near the Catholic Mission. The couple had the following children:

- Isabelle, b. 1852, died 1856.
- Madeleine, b. 1854, married Antoine Faillant dit Lafontaine.
- Sarah, b. 1856.
- Rose, b. 1857, married Gregoire A. Wills (Welsh) then married Alexandre Peletier.
- Pierre, b. 1859, married Betsy Welsh.
- Philomene, b. 1860, married Pierre Pelletier.
- Roderick, b. 1862.
- Urbain, b. 1865.
- Florestine, b. 1867, married Michel Thibault.
- Elzear, b. 1869, married Elizabeth Pelletier.
