

Montour, Bernard “Bien”. (b. 1855)

,Bien was born at Pembina, the son of Pascal Montour Sr. and Madeleine Richard. Pascal Sr. was the son of Robert Bonhomme Montour and Josette Spence. In 1873, Pascal was issued Scrip # 275 (160 acres) under the Red Lake and Pembina Treaty. Pascal Jr. was a member of Captain Bernard Paul’s company, one of the 19 *dizaines* led by Gabriel Dumont during the 1885 Métis Resistance. In 1880 he married Marguerite Smith, they lived at the St. Laurent Settlement (Section 31 NW quarter, T43-1-3), on the west side of the river.
