13,000 Dwelling Units

Which means a lot of houses, and there are about 11,000 unattached and attached (duplex) homes. Dwelling units number about 16,000. A dwelling unit is a house, apartment or room in which housekeeping is set up.

There are 42 banks and office buildings in the city. In 1883 the place had two banks, but that was too many so one closed up.

The city has 215 stores, 60 churches, 85 public buildings, 94 workshops, bakeries, factories. creameries. It boasts 80 garages and 146 warehouses and mail order houses. There are 20 hotels, five greenhouses, and four grain elevators.

Regina is protected by 112 fire alarm boxes, 687 fire hydrants, three and a half miles of two and a half inch fire hose. There is also a mile of smaller fire hose.

95 Miles of Wiring

The 1,067 street lights are kept together with 95 miles of wiring. The colored lights that decorate the city for the victory loan number 945.
