

Donna G. Sutherland. (b. 1961)

Donna G. Sutherland is a Métis author, born in Selkirk, Manitoba, on April 9, 1961. She writes primarily historical and biographical material on Métis and other Aboriginal people. She is a great-great-great-great granddaughter of Margaret Nahowway Sinclair (1775-1863).

Donna received her BA in Psychology and Anthropology from the University of Winnipeg. She lives in Petersfield, Manitoba. She was a Harrington Fellow at the Centre for Rupert's Land Studies in 2000-01. In 2004, she was a recipient of a Canada Council for the Arts grant for Aboriginal Writers and Storytellers. She was also a 2007/08 recipient of Canada Council for the Arts grant for Aboriginal and Storytellers and a similar grant in 2010. In 2008, she founded White Buffalo Books.
