

## Urbain Tourond, Métis veteran, Canadian military

Urbain was the youngest child of the marriage of Virginie Fisher and David Tourond. Urbain was born 12 Nov 1890 [1,5]. He never knew his father since David Tourond died on 11 September 1890 [2].

Urbain never married and lived with his mother Virginie and step-father Leon Hamelin until he enlisted in the Canadian army in March of 1916 [3]. His Service Number was 1009752. Urbain's unit was the Canadian Infantry (Saskatchewan Regiment), and his Division was the 46<sup>th</sup> Bn. Private Urbain Tourond died in battle on October 26, 1917. He has no known grave but he is memorialized in the Menin Gate (Ypres) Memorial Cemetery in Belgium [4].

Urbain was the young brother of Marie Tourond and Alexandrine Tourond. Urbain was a grandson of George Fisher, Emilie Boyer, Joseph Tourond, and Josephite Tourond (Paul). Urbain was a granduncle of Stephen, Alexander, and Anthony Hardy.
